

22 out of the 41 (54%) professionals who attended the meeting completed the evaluation questionnaire. Of them 60 % were members of APN. 55 % were NGO and 27% public health officers.

The two most important logistical factors that influenced the decision to attend this conference were conference dates (41%) and networking opportunities (36%).

The overall impression of the meeting was good in 55% of cases and excellent in 41 %

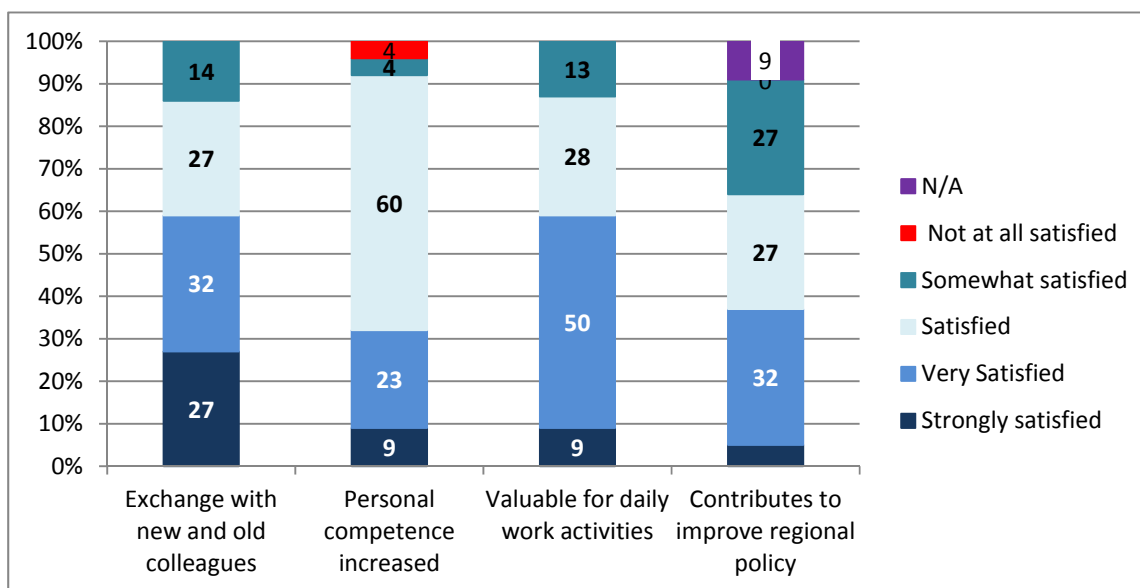


Figure 1: Impact of the conference

The potential impact of the meeting (see fig. 1):

- 86% were satisfied with the opportunity for exchange with new and old colleagues.
- 90% were satisfied with the increased in personal competence.
- 86 % were satisfied with the value for daily work activities
- 63 % thought this meeting contributed to improving regional policies

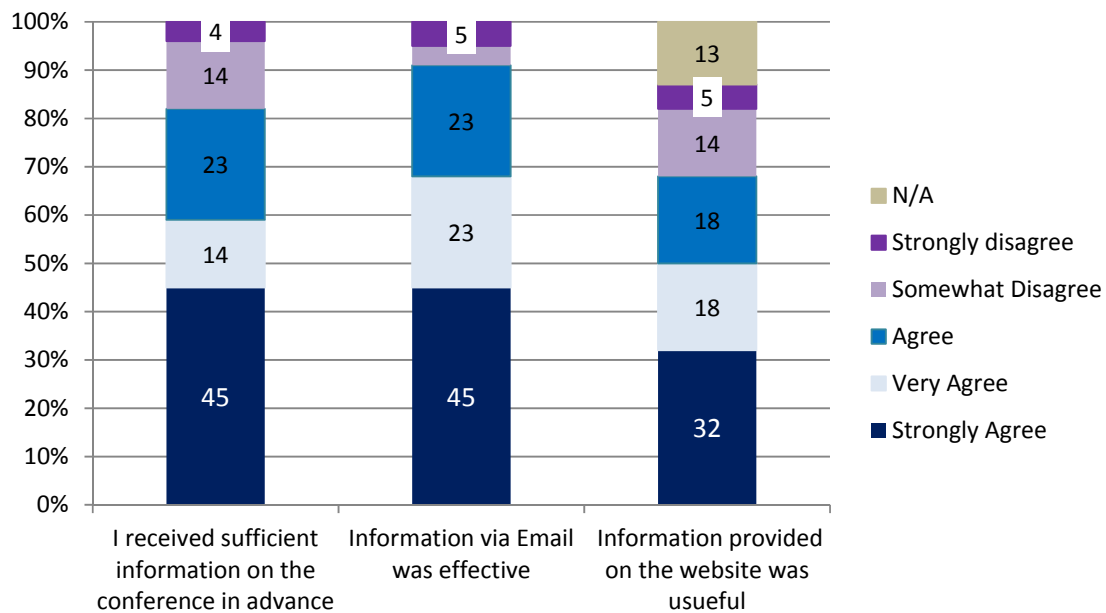


Figure 2: Pre-meeting issues

Pre-meeting Issues (see fig 2):

- 81 % received sufficient information on the conference in advance
- 91 % thought that the information via Email was effective
- 68% thought that the information provided on the website was useful.

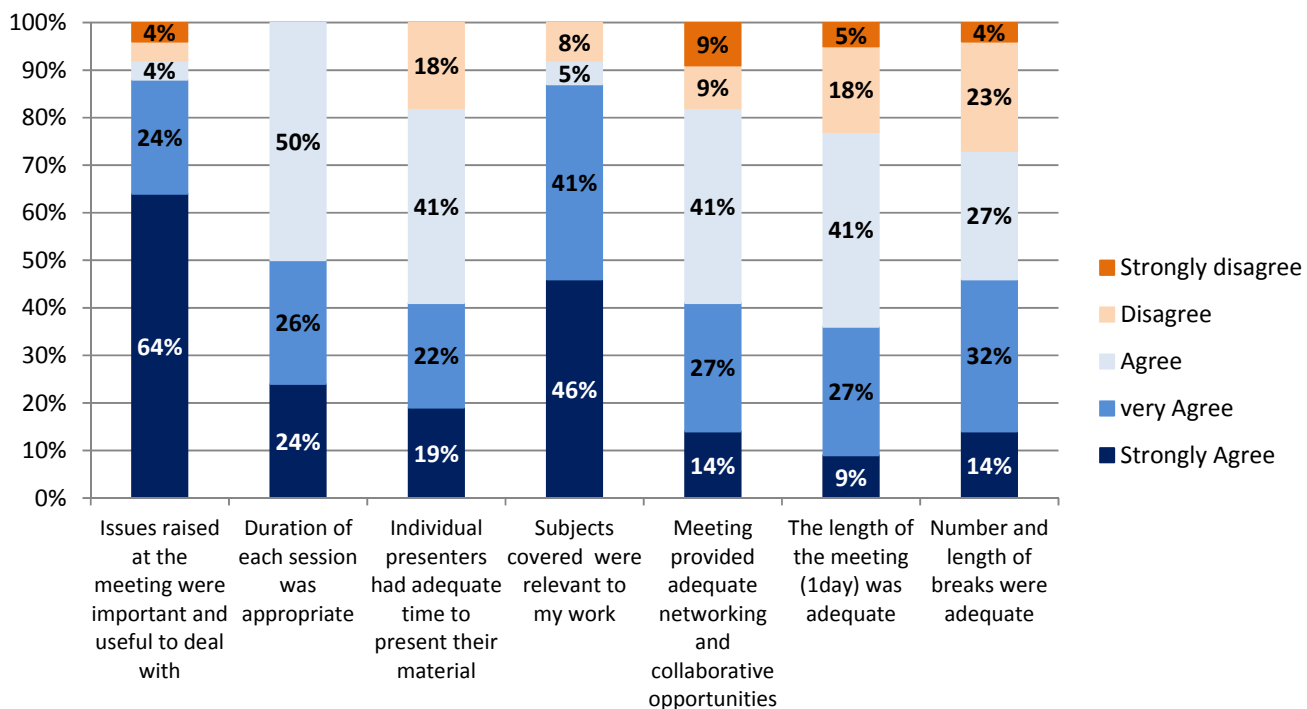


Figure 3: General issues

General issues (see fig. 3):

- 90 % found the meeting important and useful.
- 100 % agreed with the duration of each session
- 82 % agreed that the time for the individual presenters was adequate
- 91 % thought that this meeting was relevant to their work
- 82 % opined that the meeting provided adequate networking and collaborative opportunities.
- 78 % opined that the length of the meeting provided was adequate
- 72% agreed with the number and length of breaks

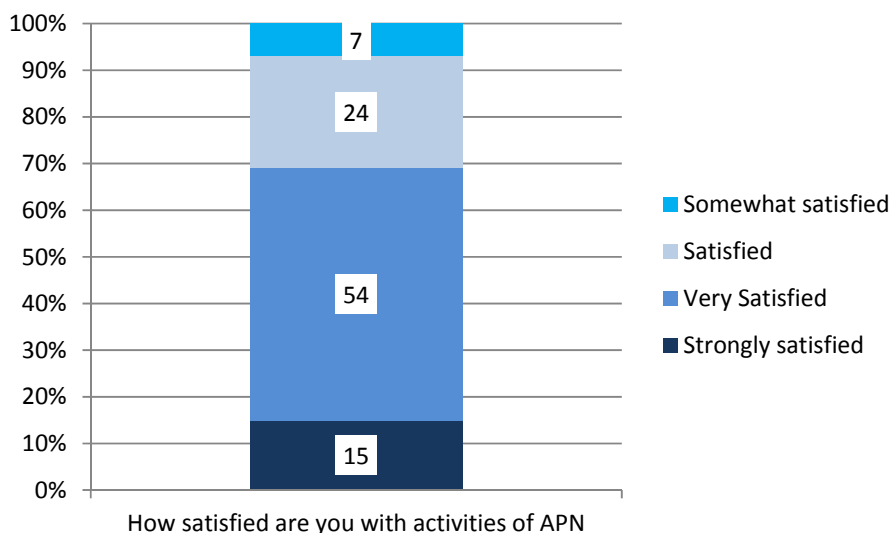


Figure 4: Satisfaction rate with the activities of APN meeting APN

The global satisfaction with activities of meeting was 94% (see fig. 4)

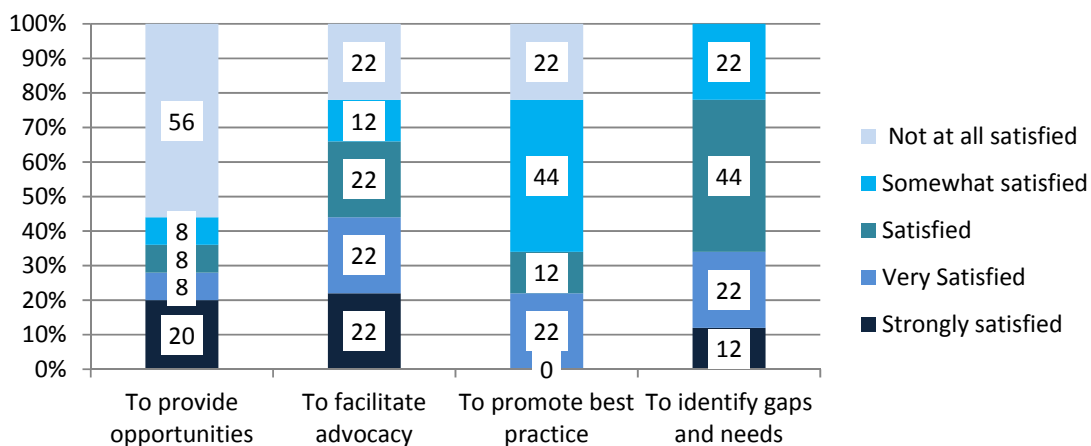


Figure 5. Satisfaction rates to activities of APN in future

What should be the main activities of APN in future? (see fig. 5)

Only 36% were satisfied with the activities to provide opportunities for people in leading positions in public health oriented policy to meet independently, exchange information, keep up to date on pertinent developments in the field at global, EU, country and individual community level and establish cooperative activities.

66% were satisfied with the activities to facilitate advocacy training on public health alcohol policies and provide assistance to countries and institutions to adapt and implement alcohol policies.

34% were satisfied with the activities to promote best practice and develop guidelines on the basis of Knowledge knowledge and experiences gained.

78% were satisfied with the activities to identify gaps and needs for research in the field of alcohol policies, research and promote European cooperation.
