

19 out of the 70 (27%) professionals who attended the conference completed the evaluation questionnaire.

47.4% were Public health officers, 26.3% belonged to NGO, 10.5% were Policy Adviser and 10.5% were health professionals.

The participants who completed the survey were from 9 countries.


The two most important logistical factors that influenced the decision to attend this conference were networking opportunities (63.15%) and conference dates (47.3%).

The overall impression of the conference was excellent in 72% of cases and good in 28%.

The potential impact of the conference (see fig. 1):

- 63% were satisfied with the opportunity for interaction with colleagues
- 94.7% were satisfied with the increase in personal competence
- 84% were satisfied with the value for daily work activities
- 52.5% thought this conference contributed to improving regional policies




Figure 3: General conference feedback

Main Activities of APN in the future (see fig. 4):

- 72.5% opined that they are important to provide opportunities for people in leading positions in public health oriented policy to meet independently, exchange information, keep up to date on pertinent developments in the field at global, EU, country and individual community level and establish cooperative activities
- 30% found them important to facilitate advocacy training on public health alcohol policies and provide assistance
- 70% opined that they are important to promote best practice and develop guidelines on the basis of knowledge and experiences gained. To identify gaps and needs for research in the field of alcohol policies, research and promote European cooperation
- 36% found them important to identify gaps and needs for research in the field of alcohol policies, research and promote European cooperation
